CAMDEN – Mayor Dana Redd and Department of Human Services Director Mark Merrill officially opened Camden’s city pools Monday morning.

The city’s pools are at North Camden Community Center (Pyne Poynt Park at 6th and Erie streets) and the Isabel Miller Community Center at 8th Street and Carl Miller Boulevard.

In addition, six parks throughout the city will be designated “Safe Places to Play” by the YMCA of Camden and Burlington Counties.

Trained staff from the YMCA will be at the parks from 1 to 6 p.m. through Aug. 28 from 1 to 6 p.m. offering organized physical activities and sports, including sports drills, structured play time, recreational activities and free healthy snacks.

Parks include Dudley Grange Park, Stockton Park and parks at 3101 Federal St. and 404 Dudley St. in East Camden; Northgate Park, Point Street Park, Pyne Poynt Park and parks at 600 Elm St., Point and York streets and 1068 North 7th Street in North Camden; and Judge Robert Johnson Park and the park at 1600 South 8th St. in Liberty Park.
